Teamwork involves advance preparation and collaboration to manage and adapt to the needs of interpreted interactions, to gain closure post-assignment, and to apply new understandings to future interactions. Participants will gain a greater understanding of the importance of Deaf interpreters' successful teamwork with interpreter colleagues, both Deaf and hearing.

The participants will be able to:

- Effectively explain the roles, functions, and processes of the interpreting team.
- Identify the several factors affecting the interpreting team.
- Demonstrate effective team processes for verifying meaning, gathering clarifying information, managing information flow within the team, and ensuring an agreed upon team monitoring process for complete and accurate interpretation.
